OVERVIEW

Learn how to design, lead, and evaluate engaging learning experiences—both in and out of the classroom—in higher and post-secondary education. Explore theory and real-world practice of teaching and learning with a focus on curriculum design, effective instructional strategies, and the identity development and experiences of today's diverse learner populations. Applicable to any professional supporting learning in higher education or post-secondary settings. Credits earned can also be applied toward various master's or doctoral degree programs.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Minimum Degree Requirements

The micro-Certificate of Graduate Study (mCGS) in Learning and Development in Higher Education is a 9-credit program made up of 3 courses across 3 categories; 1 required course in "Teaching and Learning Foundations," 1 elective in "Understanding Post-Secondary Learners," and 1 elective in "Curriculum & Pedagogy." Each student receives a faculty advisor to support academic and professional development through the mCGS experience.
